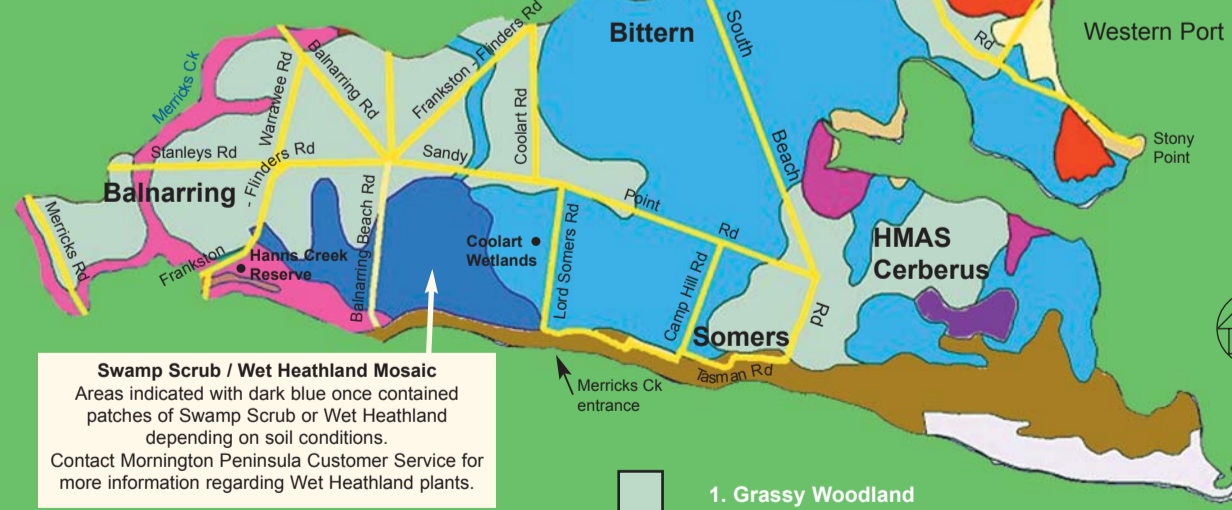
Speak to your local indigenous nursery regarding the availability of plants listed above.

Somers Region Ecological Vegetation Class Map

This map is based on EVC maps of the modelled distribution of pre-1750 vegetation boundaries (NRE 2002). Less than 40% of native vegetation cover is remaining today within the Somers region.

It is intended as a guide for determining the EVC in which you will be planting. For more detailed information regarding the boundaries of EVCs in this area, contact Mornington Peninsula Shire Customer Service.
