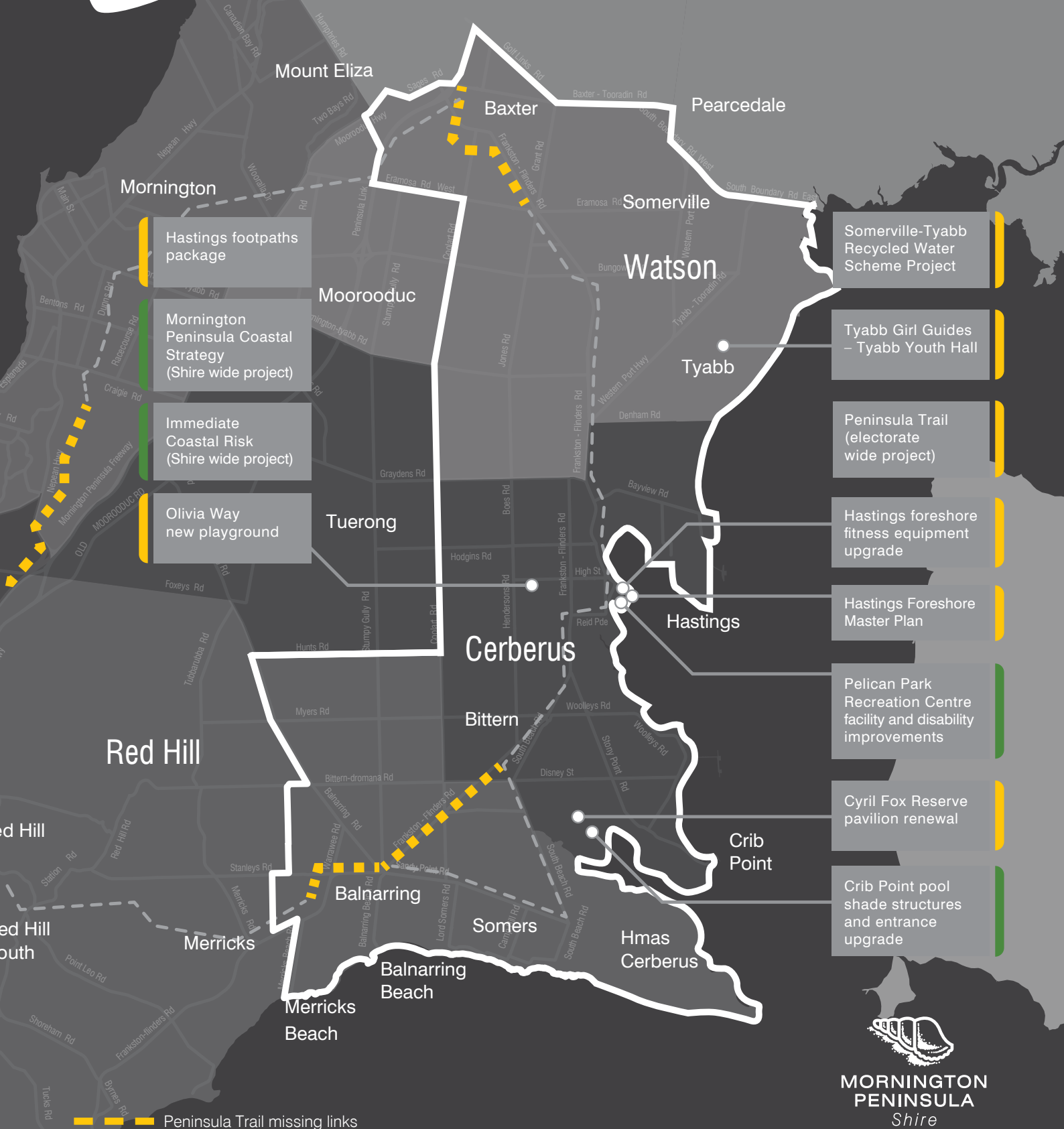

## Somerville to Tyabb Recycled Water Scheme

Recycled water is a valuable resource, and this project aims to capture, treat and pipe around 1500 million litres per annum of high-quality recycled water to local farmers - reducing their need to use drinking water for commercial and agricultural applications.

Working closely with South East Water, the Victorian Government and the local community, the Shire is exploring ways to develop a recycled water scheme servicing agri-businesses in the Somerville, Tyabb and Pearcedale areas. The gross value of horticultural production in the region, largely broccoli and salad vegetable production, is \$44 million per year.

The scheme has the potential to:

- provide a reliable water supply for irrigation.
- increase the region's resilience to the impacts of climate change.
- benefit waterways and liveability as farmers will no longer need to store catchment run-off.
- decrease the diversion of water from environmental assets and open space.
- ensure a more sustainable future for farming on the Peninsula.

## Tyabb Girl Guides/ Youth Hall

Redevelopment of the Tyabb Girl Guides /Youth Hall will:

- provide a home for the local Girl Guides.
- provide a functional space for the township's youth.
- retain and protect an important heritage building.
- provide a valuable community space for meetings, gatherings, activities and education.

## Peninsula Trail Balnarring to Bittern

Significant missing sections of Peninsula Trail are within the Hastings electorate. With the 4.64km Somerville to Baxter missing section fully funded, construction is expected to commence in early 2023.

Our focus is now on securing funding for the construction of the Balnarring to Bittern section (5.7km of which 3km is within the Hastings electorate), to improve local connections. Together, the two trail sections will:

- form part of a fully integrated and accessible trail network across the Peninsula.
- contribute significant economic benefits to the Hastings electorate.
- improve health and wellbeing outcomes across the Hastings electorate.
- boost the Shire's tourism profile as a premium cycling and walking destination.

## Cyril Fox Reserve pavilion renewal

Cyril Fox Reserve needs a new pavilion to cater for the expanding needs of local sporting clubs. As the home of the Crib Point Magpies Senior Football Netball Club, Crib Point Cricket Club (seniors and juniors) and Junior Football Club, the pavilion and grounds host visiting teams from all over the Peninsula and beyond year-round.

An upgraded pavilion will:

- create a new sporting hub at the heart of the Crib Point township.
- bring the facility up to code in the provision of modern standards for umpire facilities, safe and inclusive player change spaces and adequate storage.
- provide two new player changing rooms, a kitchen, public toilets, space for visiting clubs and improved access for disabled players and visitors.

## Pelican Park Recreation Centre

Pelican Park is the premier recreation centre servicing the Western Port community, visitors and school groups from across the Peninsula. Offering over 50 group cardio sessions per week, a lifestyle gym, functional training space, 25 metre indoor pool, toddler pool, aqua play, spa and steam facilities, the facility has something for everyone of all ages and abilities.

The current facility is 20 years old, having supported the physical and mental health outcomes of thousands of participants in that time. Investment will provide structural upgrades, disability improvements and clean and modern facilities for years to come.

## Crib Point pool shade structures and entrance upgrade

Crib Point pool is a 25-metre outdoor pool and the only public aquatic facility on the Peninsula. The pool services recreation users, swim lessons, squad, aqua aerobics and many school carnival days.

A shaded toddler pool, large shady grass areas, picnic tables, clean and comfortable change rooms and an affordable kiosk make it the perfect day out for locals and visitors.

However, the facilities are dated and require investment to upgrade so it continues to provide invaluable physical and mental health outcomes for the community.

## Hastings foreshore fitness equipment upgrade

The Western Port community is active and outdoor oriented. Popular fitness equipment on the foreshore has been removed as it was no longer safe. New equipment will:

- provide a combination of moving and static fitness activity stations.
- be freely available to the public.
- provide social and physical benefits to the community.

## Hastings footpaths package

Including Hodgins Road and Skinner Street, Hastings, Disney Street and Milne Street, Crib Point, Park Lane and Worwong Avenue, Somerville, Civic Court, Balnarring and Camp Hill, Somers

Footpaths have been highlighted as a key priority by the community via our Budget feedback. New and upgraded footpaths include:

- Hodgins Road, Hastings - \$35k - 70 metre missing links path between Victoria Street and Marine Parade to provide pedestrian access to the bus stop and Hastings Uniting Church.
- Skinner Street, Hastings- \$350k - 70 metre missing links path between Victoria Street and Marine Parade to provide pedestrian access to the bus stop and Hastings Uniting Church.
- Disney Street, Crib Point - \$750k – 1km long path between Verdun Street and Stony Point Road to provide pedestrian connections to the side streets which connect to Disney Street and create a link to the commercial area of Crib Point, Morradoo Station and Western Port/Peninsula trail.
- Milne Street, Crib Point - \$180k – 185 metre path between Martin Street and Park Road to provide a pedestrian connection through the bushland reserve into Crib Point Primary and enhance pedestrian access to St Joseph's Primary.
- Park Lane and Worwong Avenue, Somerville- \$525k – 650 metre path along Park Lane and Worwong Ave from east of the Somerville Tennis club to Somerville Rise Primary to provide connections to the primary school, Somerville Secondary college and Somerville Recreation Reserve.
- Civic Court, Balnarring- \$340k – 370 metre path from Balnarring Primary School to Balnarring Community Hall/Skatepark/Balnarring Preschool to provide connections to the primary school and to the centre of Balnarring.
- Camp Hill Road, Somers (Stage 2) \$550k - 900 metre path to between RW Stone Reserve and Stony Point Road. This will provide a path from the Somers township to the existing shared path along Sandy Point Road.

## Hastings Foreshore Master Plan

The Hastings foreshore is highly valued by the community as a social and recreational space as well as providing boaters with access to Western Port Bay.

However, the site is subject to inundation at current sea levels and the risk steadily increases into the future. The new Hastings Foreshore Masterplan will:

- provide clear climate and risk mitigation measures for the vulnerable foreshore
- support improved health and wellbeing outcomes for the community
- improve the capability for events to be hosted at the foreshore
- enhance the highly desired open space of the Hastings foreshore.

## Immediate Coastal Risk

Annual funding commitment for immediate damage control for risks such as landslips, erosion and infrastructure damage resulting from storm surges and erosion events, to match Council funding.

This will help to address risk to people, public infrastructure and ensure access to our beaches is maintained across the Mornington Peninsula.
