1st Mornington Scouts – Scout Hall Mural

\$10,000.00

To create a mural that encompasses the Scouting experiences and culture and beautify our hall to deter graffiti vandalism.

Community Kinders Plus – Mural Proposal at Mt Eliza Preschool and Maternal & Child Health Centre

\$692.00

Create a mural on the exterior walls of Mount Eliza Preschool and Maternal & Child Health Centre.

Dromana Primary School – School of Fish

\$10,000.00

School of Fish mosaic artwork will be installed on the exterior of the school boatshed, created by Dromana Primary School students, staff, their families and wider community. The artwork is made up of individual tiles created by hand that represents aspects of the forest or the bay.

OzHarvest Limited – Nutrition Education and Cooking Skills Training Program

NEST 2.0 is a public health nutrition program that aims to improve the food literacy and dietary behaviours of vulnerable adults. The program delivers a series of 2.5-hour workshops to participants by partnering with charitable agencies. Each workshop is delivered by a qualified dietitian and the workshops involve core nutrition education topics including healthy eating, label reading and budgeting, group activities, goal setting, cooking, and sharing of a meal together.
