

Creative Community Grant 2021 Program Summary



Andrea Rowe – Front Beach, Back Beach - Shoreline Stories \$3,650.00

Youth focussed, hosted story-sharing program for young people in a contemporary, creative setting. This arts engagement workshop and story sharing will provide participants with 'where to next' suggestions to build on their experiences.

Dromana Primary School – School of Fish - Participatory Art Project \$10,000.00

Participatory mosaic project offers an opportunity to connect and create together by creating personalised clay tiles. The completed mosaic artwork will be made up of 200+ glazed and fired ceramic tiles to be installed in a prominent position within the community.

Lisa Roet – Local Art as a Response to the COP26 Summit \$10,000.00

Series of workshops, talks and forums in collaboration with local businesses and an exhibition of artworks and jewellery to highlight the recent COP26 United Nations call for sustainable futures and preservation of Biodiversity and forests.

Liz Walker – While We Were Sleeping \$9,950.00

An exhibition of and about the plastic waste washed up shorelines illustrating the detrimental effect on our marine and birdlife. The exhibition includes sculpture assemblage, painted portraits of plastic waste, a 140 cm high hourglass, reflective pool installation and wooden ark constructed out of local beach plastic waste and recycled materials.

Mornington Peninsula Music Network Inc – All Abilities Choir - Workshops and Performance \$10,000.00

The 'All Abilities Choir' is a 3-day workshop followed by a live concert presenting a performance from the participants of their learnt songs.

Peninsula Culture Collective – LIFT- A Weekend of Multi-Arts and Cultural Entertainment and Workshops \$10,000.00

'LIFT' is a number of performance pieces and activities delivered in various locations, designed to stimulate the senses through dance, theatre, story slam, spoken word, visual arts, music and cultural practices, including a smoking ceremony and yidaki meditation.

\$10,000.00

Creating a series of engaging and collaborative writing events to encourage and value the storytelling voice and writing talent of writers in our community.

Peter Crawley-Boevey – Stories Behind the Street Murals Commissioned by Mornington Peninsula Shire.
\$10,000.00

Filming the stories of the conception through to realisation of the final artwork of four of the street murals commissioned by Mornington Peninsula Shire. A great story gives an audience an experience that allows them to see and feel the world as though they are the character in the story, in this case, the Artist.

Radio Port Phillip Association Inc – Always Was: Boon Wurrung Land (TV series)
\$10,000.00

Develop, produce and broadcast an 8-part factual TV series hosted by Boon Wurrung people. They will explore the Aboriginal history of the Mornington Peninsula, selecting one site each week to focus on sharing its stories, First People, flora, fauna and bush tucker.

Rosebud Astral Theatre Society and Southern Peninsula Players – Sharing Our Talents

An amalgamation of two well-established groups coming together to produce and perform The Addams Family musical in May 2022.

Seawinds Community Hub – Singing for Fun and Vitality at Seawinds
\$860.00

Creating monthly fun filled nights of music and trivia for social connection, in collaboration with the Rosebud Men's Shed.

The Rotary Club of Mornington Inc – Mornington Art Show
\$6,750.00

Conduct the 50th Mornington Art Show in the new Mornington Community House and Studio. The artists and pieces on display are mainly from the Mornington Peninsula region and the show aspires to increase its photography and student sections.
