Balnarring Community Hub Incorporated – Balnarring & Surrounds Community Hub Communications Project

The Community Hub Communications Project will support the development and communication of the programs by using various communications tools such as a website, social media, print distribution and signage, ensuring all ages and demographics are aware of activities available to them. It is intended to reach more than 15,300 people from Balnarring, Balnarring Beach, Bittern, Flinders, Main Ridge, Merricks, Merricks North, Merricks Beach, Point Leo, Red Hill, Shoreham, Somers, Tuerong and Arthurs Seat.

Food For Change – Increasing farm productivity through a walk-behind tractor.

Funding is to assist with purchase of a 'walk-behind tractor' and attachments for use at the food security farm located at The Briars . A walk-behind tractor would greatly improve efficiency and effectiveness and it is estimated the tractor will improve output by 50,000 meals annually.

Girl Guides Mornington Peninsula District – Roof Repairs at Mornington Guide Hall

Point Nepean Men's Shed Association – Community Buddy Benches \$2,500.00

Funding is to build 10 timber seats and install them at St Josephs Primary School and other sites such as schools, preschools and community houses in our local area. Final decoration would be for the individual organisation to add their own touches.

Ranelagh Residents Association Inc. – Ranelagh Estate Signage \$5,000.00 <http://www.ranelaghestate.org.au>

This project will be in 2 parts:

1. Create informational signage with brief outline of the Ranelagh Estate history and attach to the rear of the existing 3 Ranelagh Estate entry signs for the benefit of foot traffic. The text will consist of a cut-down version of the words displayed on the main Ranelagh Estate Sign erected in the Mount Eliza Village.
2. To reproduce the old Ranelagh Estate street directory sign on the JT Smith Reserve with a modern sign showing reserves, key locations and community buildings and facilities within the Ranelagh Estate. The final sign will be in 2 pieces as was the original.
