Height for grasses, sedges and rushes is to the top of the flowering stem.

Rosebud Region Ecological Vegetation Class Map

This map is based on EVC maps of the modelled distribution of pre-1750 vegetation boundaries (NRE 2002). Less than 40% of native vegetation cover is remaining today within the Rosebud region.

It is intended as a guide for determining the EVC in which you will be planting. For more detailed information regarding the boundaries of EVC's in this area, contact Mornington Peninsula Shire Customer Service.
