

# Placemaking Grant 2023/24

## Program Summary



### **Bayview Care Ltd. – Matt Adnate Mural at 1095 Point Nepean Rd** **\$10,000.00**

World-renowned mural artist Matt Adnate to create a mural on the exterior wall reflective of the Mornington Peninsula and its people, which will capture the unique character of our community and become a local landmark for locals and tourists to visit and view.

### **Dromana Bowls Club – Enhancement of information sharing and acknowledgements** **\$2,495.00**

To update our acknowledgements and information sharing by upgrading to a large screen TV in the clubroom. This can be utilised to acknowledge past and present players achievements, (replacing honour boards dating back many years.) It can also be used to advertise upcoming events, to acknowledge current sponsors, to seek volunteers for specific activities and to celebrate ongoing activities in the club.

### **Mount Eliza Chamber of Commerce – Performance and engagement on the Village Green** **\$8,500.00**

For the creation of a small stage in the Village Green to revitalise the Village by providing a vibrant space for events, performances, and gatherings. The stage will serve as a focal point, encouraging local artists, schools and community groups to showcase their talents and bring people together. The stage will enhance the Village's social fabric, promote local talent, and attract visitors; boosting our local economy and strengthening community engagement.

### **Mt Martha Bowls, Petanque and Social Club Inc – Club House Entrance Pergola** **\$10,000.00**

For construction of pergola outside the entrance to the club house, linking the Club House to the outside deck's balustrade. It will provide summer shade for comfort for members and visitors alike, whether socialising and/or watching games in progress.

### **National Trust of Australia (Victoria) – Environment and Education Centre at the Endeavour Fern Gully: Activation and Engagement** **\$10,000.00**

This project relates to Stage 2: Community engagement, interpretation and activation, of a newly constructed Environment and Education Centre. Community engagement and activation will promote the Centre and enable visitors, tourists, researchers, students and other community members to benefit from the Centre, thus contributing to social connection and inclusion.

### **Presentation Family Centre Inc trading as Saltbush, Balnarring Beach – Saltbush Community Garden** **\$10,000.00**

To create a community garden near the entry to Saltbush, Balnarring Beach including establishing garden beds, fruit trees, herbs and installation of raised vegetable beds, and a chicken coop. The community garden will create opportunities for innovative programs that engage and support the community, including for those experiencing social isolation.

### **Rotary Club of Mt Eliza – Mt Eliza Park Furniture** **\$9,000.00**

The proposal is for provision of one 'all access' (ie disability friendly) park bench, one 'traditional' park bench along with two park bench seats. The park is situated a distance from other community park facilities in Mt Eliza. The current table capacity is less than what is required for the level of utilisation of the park, particularly by family groups. The proposal doubles the table capacity and adds additional seating capacity.

### **St Andrews Recreation Club – Activity Pad incorporating down-ball court and basketball ring** **\$10,000.00**

The activity pad will comprise a combined down-ball court and basketball ring permitting both activities to run concurrently. It will be landscaped with simple bench seats for resting. The location is in an open public area.

### **St Mary's Primary School, Hastings – Nourish Our Neighbourhood: Cultivating Community through our Permaculture Garden** **\$10,000.00**

St. Mary's Primary School seeks funding to expand our permaculture garden project. We plan to construct a raised herb garden, diversify our food plantings and foster community resilience through collaborative working bee events. By partnering with local organisations and businesses, we aim to strengthen community bonds while educating students and the public about sustainable food choices and indigenous biodiversity.

### **Tanti Park Social Enterprises Ltd. – Street garden and resource hub** **\$10,000.00**

This project provides a street-facing recreation and resource space for community members. The project will include designing and building raised garden beds, planting native flora, building & maintaining a street library, street pantry and seed library and signage and art that provides decoration, attraction and guidelines.
