Important Information

- 1. Please view the application and any supporting information on Council's website or at Council's offices to clearly understand the proposal before you make an objection.
- 2. Ensure that Council receives your objection by the due date shown on the notice. Council will send you an acknowledgement letter once they have received your objection.
- 3. This form is to help you make an objection to an application in a way which complies with the *Planning and Environment Act 1987* (PE Act). There is no requirement that you use this form. However, the PE Act does state that:
 - An objection must be made to the responsible authority in writing stating the reasons for the objection and stating how the objector would be affected by the grant of the permit.
 - The responsible authority may reject an objection which it considers has been made primarily to secure or maintain a direct or indirect commercial advantage for the objector.
 - The responsible authority must make a copy of every objection available at its office for any person to inspect during office hours free of charge until the end of the period during which an application may be made for review of a decision on the application.
- 4. If Council receives your objection prior to Council determining the application, you will be notified of Council's decision. If Council decides to grant a planning permit you can seek a review of the decision to the Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT). If Council refuses the application, the permit applicant can also seek review of the decision. Applications for review are determined by VCAT. Details of how to lodge an application for review will be set out in the decision notice you receive. Further information can also be found on the VCAT website, www.vcat.vic.gov.au
- 5. If you have signed an objection in the form of a petition, only one person on the petition will be sent an acknowledgement letter and notified in writing of Council's decision.
